1. **DIRECTOR** of **MAULANA AZAD DENTAL COLLEGE & HOSPITAL** is hereby granted an authorization to operate a facility for generation, collection and storage of biomedical waste at the premises of **MAMC Compex, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi - 110002**.
2. This authorization shall be in force for a period of **3 Years** and shall be valid up to **17-03-2019**
3. This authorization is subject to the conditions stated below and to such other conditions as may be specified in the rules under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 - as amended to date.

Terms and conditions of authorization

1. The occupier shall comply with the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules made there under.
2. The Health Care Establishment (HCE) will comply with the standards prescribed in Schedule V of Bio-Medical Waste Rules, for the discharge of the Waste Water / Effluent generated from the HCE, If the HCE is having 10 beds or more then it shall submit waste water analysis report for the prescribed parameter in the BMW Rules, from any one of the Empanelled laboratories of DPCC with mentioning the disposal system whether into Sewer/Drain/Land etc. within two months from the date of issue of this Authorisation.
3. The authorization or its renewal shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer authorized by DPCC
4. The person authorized shall not rent, lend, sell, transfer or otherwise transport the bio-medical waste without obtaining prior permission of DPCC.
5. Any unauthorized change in personnel, equipments or working conditions as mentioned in the application by the person authorized shall constitute a breach of this authorization.
6. It shall be ensured that the Bio Medical Waste is finally treated within a period of 48 hours. If for any reason it becomes unavoidable, intimation should be given in writing to DPCC and measures are to be ensured so that the waste does not adversely affect human health and the environment.
7. The occupier shall have a valid agreement with the operator of a facility authorized by DPCC for disposal of the bio-medical waste in case the occupier does not treat the waste himself.
8. The occupier shall submit the copy of fresh valid agreement to this office within 15 days of expiry of previous agreement or in case of any change.
9. The occupier shall ensure that bio-medical waste is not mixed with other wastes and is segregated into containers / bags at the point of generation in accordance with Schedule-II. The Bio-Medical Waste shall be handed over to transporter / operator of a CBWTF duly segregated, labeled, tagged and kept in proper containers for the transportation as per rule.
10. The occupier shall use Sharp Boxes for the collection of the sharps at the source of the generation of the sharps for proper sharp management.
11. The occupier shall also ensure proper collection and disposal of bio-medical waste containing mercury. As per the decision taken by the BMW committee No. 1 in the meeting held on 08.02.2008, template/Declaration will be signed by the Head / Medical Superintendent / Director of the Health Care Establishment / Institution and displayed widely at various prominent location in the health care establishment. The occupier shall phase out mercury based

equipments e.g. thermometers and BP measuring equipments.

12. The Bio-Medical plastic wastes shall be disposed off either locally after proper chemical disinfection / autoclaving / micro waving followed by shredding / mutilation to prevent unauthorized reuse or through Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBWTF).

13. The occupier shall maintain records of the Bio-Medical Waste generated and disposed off/ handled on daily basis. The record shall be made available for inspection & verification to any officer authorized by DPCC.

14. The occupier shall submit the Annual Report in Form-II by 31st January every year, including information about the categories and quantities of bio-medical waste generated from 1st January to 31st December of the preceding year.

15. The occupier shall not handle the Bio-Medical Waste from any other health care institution without obtaining prior permission from DPCC for Operator of a facility failing which the occupier shall be liable for legal action for illegal handling of the bio-medical waste.

16. In case of any accident involving Bio-Medical Waste, the occupier shall report the accident in Form-III, prescribed under the Rules, to DPCC.

17. In case of failure to comply with any of the above conditions and / or with any provision of the Act or of these Rules, authorization issued to the Occupier may be suspended or cancelled as per the provisions under sub-rule 7 (8) of Bio-Medical Waste (Management & Handling) Rules, 1998, as amended to date.

18. Submission of false information shall make the authorization liable for cancellation without any notice.

19. The occupier shall apply for renewal of authorization under the aforementioned Rules before one month of the expiry of this authorization.

20. In case the occupier is having a DG Set, he shall comply with the noise standards laid down vide Gazette Notification of Ministry of Environment and Forest(MOEF), Government of India Dated 17.05.2002 and 12.07.2004, as amended to date, for the Diesel Generator Set(s). Stack height with the DG Set shall be as per the following formula, H is equal to h plus $(0.2 \times \text{square root of KVA})$ where H is Total Height of stack in meter , h is Height of the building in meters where the Generator Set is installed and KVA is Total Generator capacity of the set in KVA). The occupier shall also submit a latest noise monitoring report (not older than 6 months) of DG Set from any of the empanelled laboratories of DPCC within 3 months from the date of issue of the authorisation, if not already done.

21. Authorisation is granted with the condition that HCE shall submit an Action Plan in accordance to BMW Rules, 2016 within 30 days.

22. HCE shall ensure that they will give recyclable plastic to ~~un~~authorized dealers/recyclers only.

Please note that the issuance of authorization shall not be construed in any manner whatsoever that you are legitimately operating your health care institution with respect to other statutory requirements viz-local land use, Master Plan of Delhi etc.

The authorization is subject to the condition that you are operating as per the provision of Master plan of Delhi, 2021 and in this regard you shall submit an undertaking to DPCC within a month.
